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HSSC UPDATES

North Campus Food Pantry Donations

- The HSSC North Campus Student Food Pantry was officially opened January 2023.
- The pantry is in the Domenici Student Lounge and is available to all students 24/7 with badge access. The pantry is stocked with non-perishable food items and basic hygiene products. We ask that students use the anonymous QR code tracking system to track what items are most utilized, what is still needed, and to leave feedback.
- There are donation boxes located throughout the HSC Campus where anyone can donate non-perishable food items and hygiene products. These boxes are monitored by the HSSC and will be checked regularly.

Submission Deadline: **Friday March 15, 2024**

- The 2024 New Mexico Public Health Association (NMPHA) Annual Conference will feature New Mexico-based community-driven and/or academic posters and sessions that share advances in social determinants of health, public health, racial healing, health equity, and environmental justice in any of the following modalities: programs, practice, policy, and/or research methods. CEUs will be offered for select sessions.
- **1) Learning Sessions:** Learning Sessions will be either a 45-minute Presentation or Panel Discussion (w/ 10 min. of audience participation) or a 90-minute Workshop (w/ 20-30 min. of audience participation). We are looking for sessions that meet learning objectives in the following categories:
 - Skill Building (for example: Intro to Epidemiology)
 - Data to Action (for example: Overdose Deaths & Policy Responses to Saving Lives)
 - Critical Issues in Public Health (for example: Vaccine Mandates)
 - Promising Programs (for example: Navigational Systems to Address Poverty)
 - Consider using slides or other virtual ancillary materials (including zoom polling, etc.) if you are able.
- **2) Thriving Sessions:** Thriving Sessions will be 30-minute workshops that share practices to help us care for ourselves, sustain our work, and thrive during these challenging times. Thriving Sessions will include a 5-10-minute introduction on the benefits of the practice followed by 20-25 minutes of actual practice. Possible ideas include yoga, meditation, running, walking, art-making, music, dance, and others. We are looking for creative ideas rooted in community and wellness and will offer CEUs for these sessions.
- **3) Poster Sessions:** Poster sessions will have the opportunity to share a visual poster along with a 5-minute presentation.

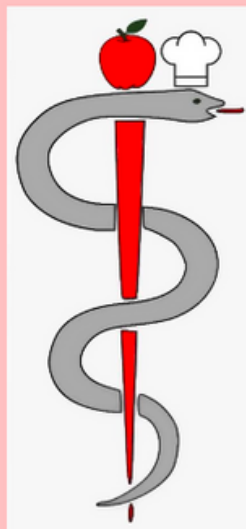

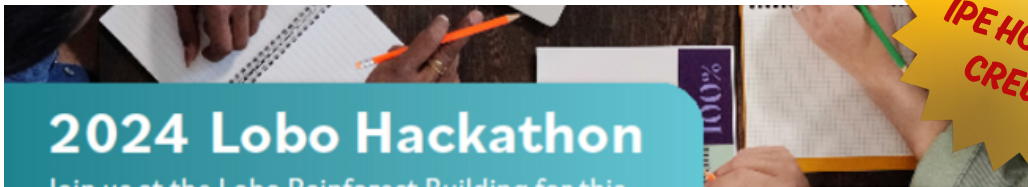

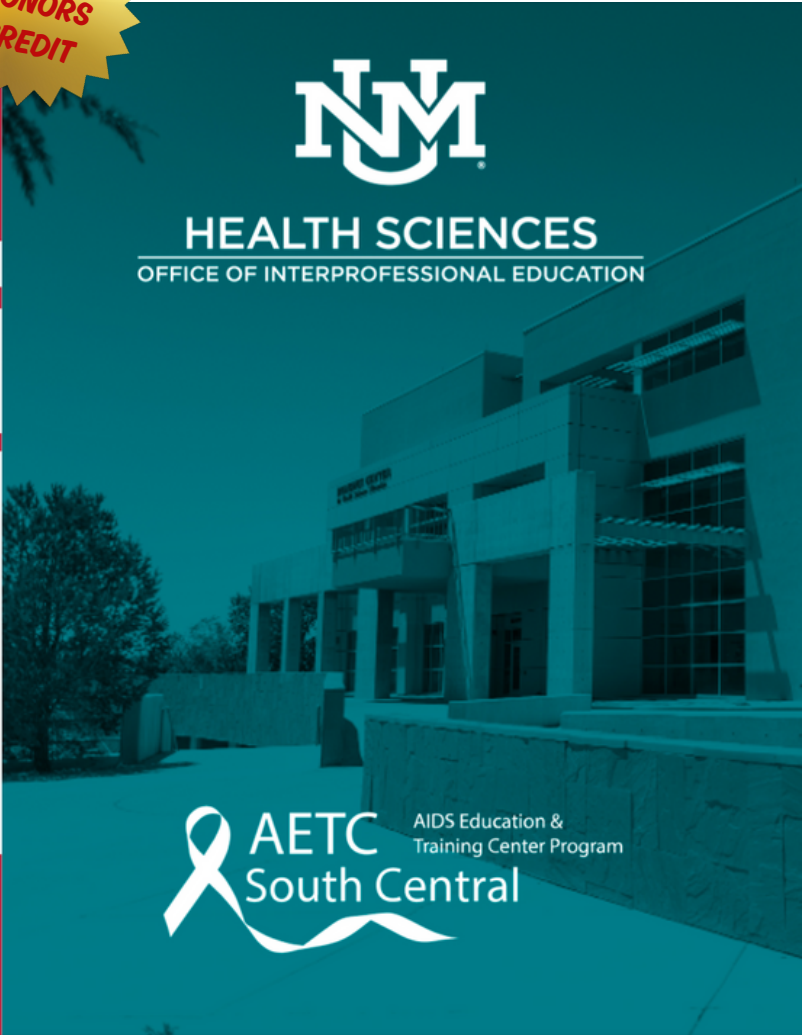

Where: **Old Mission San Luis Rey, Oceanside, CA**

- Participants should have a demonstrated interest in Integrative Medicine and demonstrated willingness to take on leadership roles within their institution or community.
- Participants may include students in the following disciplines: medicine, osteopathy, nursing, physical therapy, pharmacy, psychology, social work, allied health, chiropractic, acupuncture, massage, naturopathy, among others.
- The program will focus on developing leadership skills, Integrative Medicine education, self-care skills, and developing IM projects to implement at their own home schools.
- Once the on-site program is completed, students are expected to implement a home institution project and are eligible to apply for a \$200 grant to fund that project.
- Tuition: \$500 (US Funds)

- The newly formed Street Medicine, Addiction, and Harm Reduction Team (SMAHRT) held its first general meeting on Tuesday, January 30, 2024.
- Co-chairs Morgan Stein and Jenna Norton, both first year med students, come from a strong foundation of work and service in the field. Previously, Norton was a social worker in street medicine and substance use, while Stein volunteers at the Healthcare for the Homeless clean needle exchange.
- Norton states, “We’re trying to uphold the values and principles of those who’ve come before us and set a precedent for allied health students to learn about this incredible work.
- The huge interest in this group proves what we always knew: that students desire more training and exposure to the social problems and challenges in New Mexico communities.”
- With the oversight of Lindsay Fox, PA-C and Sara Doorley, MD, the SMAHRT team intends to expand its work like similar programs throughout the country.
- Stein adds, “So many other medical and nursing schools embrace street medicine and harm reduction programs. We want to be part of that culture of innovation and transformative disruption.”
